



## AUDITION GUIDELINES

### Directions:

If you are going to submit your client or yourself, the casting office would like you to record the audition using the sides included here. Please do not submit any other audition or a demo reel - you will need to use the scene below to be considered for the role.

### Recording Tips:

This is a voice over role, so you can submit an mp3 audio-only file. If you would prefer to do a video, that is acceptable as well but it must be in one of the following formats: mpeg, mov, mpeg4, wmv, mpg, m4v

- Record in a silent room. It might help to first record just the sound of the room and listen to it to check if there is anything distracting.
- Use a microphone if you have one. This will provide cleaner sound. Test it and play it back before you start to make sure the sound is crisp. It doesn't have to be professional quality, but the casting director should be able to make out each word you're saying clearly.
- Do not put your mouth directly on the microphone. It will blow out the audio. Stay 2-3 inches away from the microphone head.
- When you are ready to record the scene, add a verbal "slate". In the slate, PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME and AGE. You may also include the city you are from and the role you are reading for.
- Record the scenes 2 or 3 times, pausing between takes so that you can pick the best one once you've had a chance to review them.
- Listen to your final submission all the way through once you are done to check for technical errors.
